## Spring Term 2 2024



### Reading

The story follows a curious robot called Roz, who finds herself stranded in the wild on an island. Roz must learn to survive and earn the trust of the island's animals. This is a beautiful tale of acceptance, friendship and what it means to care about others.

### Maths Skills

Throughout this term, children will explore and apply their understanding of:

**Statistics** – interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms, and tables.

**Multiplication and division**– using multiplications tables that they know to multiply and divide two-digit numbers by a one-digit number using mental and formal written method.

**fractions** – recognise, find and write fractions of a set of objects using unit and non-unit fractions.

**Geometry**– recognise angles as a property of shape or a description of a turn.

**To help your child:** spend 5 mins a day chanting the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables. Also, use the TTRockstars login.

### History

This term, we consider the question:

#### **'How did Roman life influence modern Britain?'**

Children will consider historians points of views on who were the Romans and how they built their empire. The children will find out why the Romans invaded Britain. Children will then begin to learn how the Romans influenced modern Britain by; them building new roads; towns; the importance of Hadrian's wall and what life was like in Roman villa. We will then evaluate our knowledge on the Romans to be able to answer our question 'How did Roman life influence modern Britain?'



### RE

This half term we will be continuing to explore baptism and begin to look at the trinity in more depth. We will make connections between baptism, prayer and the trinity.



### Computing

This half term, the children will develop their understanding of what a branching database is and to create one. We will create physical and on-screen branching databases.

### Literacy Skills

Our first piece of writing, this half term, will be to innovate a narrative on a book called 'The Tin Forest'. The children will innovate this story by creating a new story in a different setting creating a descriptive narrative. After this, we will be writing a diary entry from the perspective of Mary Anning. This links with our science topic from Spring 1 & 2.

**Science** This term, our science focus will continue to be 'Rocks.'

This half term we will discover how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within a rock. We will be able to recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

When answering these questions, we will be working scientifically by setting up simple practical enquiries, making careful observations and recording findings.

Towards the end of this half term, we will be looking at a pioneer. The pioneer Year 3 are focusing on is Jane Goodall and how she has had an impact on our world.

### Design and Technology

This half term, children will demonstrate a range of stitching techniques to practise sewing two small pieces of fabric together in order to make a small cushion.

### PE

Children's designated PE days will be a Tuesday and a Friday.

The children will be taught gymnastics and inclusive sports.

Children need to bring their PE kit into school on a Monday and take it home on a Friday. Please ensure all kit is clearly named.
