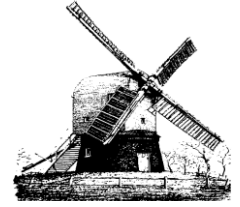


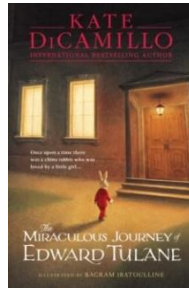

Maths Skills

Throughout this term, children will explore and apply their understanding of:
Number – to recap and apply our earlier knowledge of addition and subtraction methods to help us solve word problems.
Money – recognise coins and notes for their values, and to be able to add and subtract amounts of money to find change.

Fractions – (Y4) understanding fractions of different measures, including mass, capacity, and money.

Measurement – to understand units of measurement relating to the mass of objects or the capacity that they could hold.

Geography

This term, we consider the question: How does extreme weather affect us? We will start by looking at hurricanes: how they are formed and what chaos they cause for communities who are caught in them. We will then look at jet streams and how they relate to the extreme weather that we experience in our world. Finally, we will consider how extreme weather affects communities and businesses by looking at some recent extreme weather we have had in the UK.

RE

This term, we will try to understand 'What kind of world did Jesus want'. We will explore how Jesus and His disciples lived and consider how this relates to how we live.

Art

This half term in Art we are going to be learning about Pablo Picasso. We will create some self-portraits in the style of Picasso using a different shapes and features to make a collage. We will then draw our own features to create another version of a cubist self-portrait.

Literacy Skills

We will start off the half term with some Haiku poems. We will look at the structure of the poems and the unique characteristics which make a Haiku. Our second piece of writing will be a narrative, focusing on setting descriptions. This will give the children a wonderful opportunity to apply their grammar skills to make an interesting piece of writing.

Spanish

This half term in Spanish, we will learn some vocabulary for vegetables. We will then apply this knowledge through discussing what vegetables we do and don't like.

Science

In science, we will be learning about the parts of a flowering plant and the functions of each part. We will create experiments to test these functions and to better understand the need for each function. Our first experiment will show us how water is transported through plants by using coloured dye to see this process. The second experiment will show us how a plants environment (soil and nutrients) for growing might be different for various plants. We will also look at the theory of the life cycle of a plant to understand how plants grow and then reproduce to create more plants.

Computing

This half term the children will be using a range of techniques to create a stop-frame animation using tablets. Next, they will apply those skills to create a story-based animation.

PE

Children's designated PE days will be a Monday and a Tuesday. Children need to bring their PE kit into school on a Monday and take it home on a Friday. Please ensure all kit is clearly named. This half term in Athletics and Invasion Games.
