In reading we will....

Our daily story time book will be a selection of books including:

Phonics/Read Write Inc

The children will continue their Read Write Inc. journey, learning and progressing at their own level. Your child will bring home a RWInc reading book and a reading for pleasure book each week. To help your child, please encourage your child to read their reading book to you daily, where possible. This will help build up their phonic knowledge and fluency. Also discuss with your child what they have read ensuring they have a secure understanding of the text. The reading for pleasure book may be read by yourselves with your child.

Spellings

We now use the Active Spelling programme in school. Children will learn ten spellings a week but this will be taught in school. A copy of spellings can be found on the school website under Class 2.

Geography

This term in Geography, KS1 will be exploring the British Isles. They will use globes, maps, atlases and books to identify where the UK is situated in the world. They will explore where Wrawby is situated and revisit compass points to aid their description. They will explore the countries of the UK, naming them and locating on maps of the British Isles. Capital cities will also be explored and named. A detailed study of London will form the main part of this work. Pupils will locate and explore the important landmarks using a variety of different sources to support their work.

PE

The children will have PE lessons on Mondays and Wednesdays. The children will be learning skills needed for indoor athletics and gymnastics.

Art

This term, our work in art focuses on printing. We will be exploring what printing is, looking at the work of others. We will use the work of others to inspire our work. We will use a range of techniques and link to our London work.

Maths Skills

Throughout this term, children will learn:

- **Time** – continue to develop their knowledge of clocks and time telling as well as solving problems set in time contexts.
- **Calculation** – develop their knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and be introduced to division. Pupils will use a range of strategies to support their work in these calculations, such as part whole models, number lines and squares and manipulatives. They will solve problems using their skills in areas such as money.
- **Number** – develop their knowledge of numbers to 100. Read, write and count to 100. Order and compare numbers

To help your child, you may wish to find coins and notes to pay with when shopping, orally count in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's up to 100 and develop times table skills.

Literacy Skills

This term, we will be starting by looking at instructions. Children will read and follow instructions and then write their own instructions for a game. We will then move onto report writing. Children will collect information from different sources on predators and write a report based on their findings. Children will use a range of GPaS skills these will include:
Yr 1 – capital letters, full stops, imperative verbs, lists and joining sentences with 'and'.
Year 2 – imperative verbs, expanded noun phrases, question, exclamation, command and statement sentences and commas in a list.

Computing This term children will learn how to move a robot. They will explore using individual commands, both with other learners and as part of a computer program. They will identify what each floor robot command does and use that knowledge to start predicting the outcome of programs.

Science

Year 1 will be exploring Materials this term. They will name and explore the materials which make up the world around them, investigate their properties and plan scientific tests to challenge their thinking.
Year 2 will be exploring the uses of everyday materials. They will investigate the suitability of materials for different purposes.

RE

This term, we shall consider the question: How is Allah described in the Qur'an?

Music

Our unit this term is called, 'How does music make the world a better place?' Children will be listening, creating and performing songs focusing on dynamics and tempo.
