This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our school music curriculum is informed by the Model Music Curriculum and our school vision to "*strive for a full life in mind, body, heart and spirit*".
- Music is taught in weekly, one-hour lessons.
- In Reception and Year 1, music is taught by the class teacher, who is also a music specialist.
- Years 2 – 6 are taught by the Music Lead, a music specialist.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

We are pleased to provide opportunities for children to engage in the following:

Taiko Club

We also currently have 4 pupils having woodwind lessons with a teacher from North Lincolnshire Music Service.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Our children sing regularly in Collective Worship. They take part in a dedicated Worship through Song every week to learn and practice hymns and other suitable songs. Every academic year, we come together as a whole school community to perform an array of songs to families and friends in our local church at Harvest, Remembrance Day, Christmas and Easter. Music also plays a major role in the Year 6 Leaver's concert.

Our choir performs outside of school in our local community, singing for our church services and at a local residential home. The Taiko group has performed in concerts at the Plowright Theatre in Scunthorpe and at the Central Hall in Grimsby at the invitation of Humber Taiko.

A concert band from a local secondary school performs for our pupils at the end of the summer term.

In the future
